A few words from the Criw

Members of our Criw Cymraeg, Thomas, Louie and Noah had this to say about our Welsh Week:

We are part of the Criw Cymraeg at Ysgol Y Llan Whitford and we have an important role in developing Welsh within our school.

Our latest project as a Criw was to organise a 'Wythnos Cymraeg'. We had lots of fun doing it and here was our plan:

On Dydd Llun, we held a famous Welsh people day, where we researched lots of famous Welsh people, and we then made a biography of these different people. We also tried to recreate Rhiannon Roberts' famous artwork with Whitford as our theme.

On Dydd Mawrth it was the Urdd's 100th birthday celebration. We took part in and achieved a world record for the most people singing 'Hey Mistar Urdd' at the same time on social media. We had lots of fun making bracelets and playing games. We also celebrated Diwrnod Santes Dwynwen.

On Dydd Mercher we had an Eisteddfod creative day which involved completing arts and crafts and other items to compete in our school Eisteddfod.

On Dydd Iau we had a 'Proud to be Welsh' day. We finished our week off selling hufen ia at break time from our Pod Siarad to raise money for the Criw Cymraeg. In total we raised approximately £22. Everyone had to ask for their hufen ia in Welsh and the Criw would respond appropriately. We all had great fun during Wythnos Cymraeg and especially during the hufen ia sale. On our last day of our Wythnos Cymraeg, we did an Alphabet reading focus where we all learnt all about our Welsh alphabet and drew some pictures to go with them. This was to help our nursery and reception children to learn their Welsh alphabet.

We have many ongoing projects and one of ours is currently working towards our *Aur Award*. We have a Welsh games system in place where three people in Class 4 organise a 30-minute activity for the rest of Class 4 during our break time every Wednesday. We are looking forward to using our new trim trail which is being installed. This will provide lots of new opportunities for new games and activities, supporting the health and wellbeing of all.

We love being part of the Criw Cymraeg and we are always busy thinking about new ideas to help

promote Cymraeg in our school.
