## DID YOU KNOW?

Every month, girls in the UK face period poverty: two fifths (40%) have had to use toilet roll because they can't afford proper sanitary products.

There are campaigns to educate women about the alternatives to plastic period products.

The average age for periods to begin is 12, but it can range from 8 to 17 as well.

Cotton buds, wipes, dental floss and period products should always be put in the bin, and never flushed down the toilet.

If you flush wipes and period products down the toilet, they will find their way into rivers, waterways and eventually the sea.

Tampons, pads and panty liners generate more than 200,000 tonnes of waste per year, the majority of which contain plastic
