

Well-deserved Iwan!









Whole School Project

Morning Arrangements - reminder!

- 1. ALL pupils enter school through the school hall. The doors open at 8.00am for childcare and the free breakfast club starts at 8.30am.
- 2. From 8.45am, any Key Stage 2 pupils may put their belongings away and enter the classroom. This can be from the hall after 8.45am or directly from the playground. Foundation Phase pupils will remain on the playground until 8.55am as their classrooms are often being prepared for the day ahead.
- 3. When the school bell sounds, all remaining Key Stage 2 pupils will walk directly to class. Foundation Phase pupils will line up outside their cloakroom doors at the rear of the school.
- 4. Any pupils arriving in school after 8.55am will need to be signed in by their parents on the digital entry sign system. Children MUST NOT be sent up to the foyer doors by themselves for their own safety.

REMINDERS

- Please pass morning messages on via Breakfast Club staff (Miss C Davies or Mrs E Davies) unless urgent. If it is an urgent matter, then the Breakfast Club staff will check if the class teacher is available for you.
- School staff are always visible and available at the end of the school day.
- Please make appointments to see class teachers in advance where possible.
- Pupils need PE kits in school immediately.
- We always start a new term on Week 1 of the school menu.
- HEALTHY fruit and vegetables for snack only.
 Children can bring in refillable bottles for the water throughout the day.
- Please ensure all payments are made in advance including school meals, breakfast club and after school club.
- Black school shoes must be worn as part of our school uniform.
