FANTASTIC News!

If you can remember, the pupils of Dosbarth 3 took part in and won the Llaeth y Llan 'Recycle Your Pots' competition last year.

Their winning design was a bug hotel using the recycled yogurt pots for the 'rooms'. Each child designed a 'room' and they then created the hotel using natural materials found around the school grounds. Dosbarth 3 named their bug hotel 'Gwesty Malwen'.

A couple of weeks ago, we received the winning cheque of £1000.

In consultation with staff and pupils, Miss Roberts has earmarked the winnings on improving our ICT and to date has purchased the following items with $\pounds 400$ left to spare.

- 16 BBC micro-bits
- 3 Osmo sets (to use with iPad) to develop coding and problem-solving skills
- Coding Jam (to create music)

• Electric circuits

I'm sure the children are going to enjoy and benefit from the new resources.

Diolch to Miss Roberts, Dosbarth 3 and all involved.








ICT Funding

We have been developing our ICT provision over the last few years using funding from our Friends of the School (PTA), delegated budget and Welsh Government funding through the Diocesan.

Each class benefits from a good number of personal devices such as iPads and/or laptops. In addition to this, we have a set of 16 iPads and 16 Chromebooks for shared use. Recently, each class has had two new desktop computers to replace outdated hardware. Over the last two years, we have utilised available grants to replace 3 out of the 4 Active Whiteboards with hi-tech Smartboards (pictured

below). Class 1 are next to have a Smartboard installed.

With the New Curriculum on the horizon, we have been fortunate enough to have access to Welsh Government funding. This year we had our internal server upgraded, and 7 new laptops. Next year, our wi-fi throughout the school is being upgraded and we have ordered 10 new Chromebooks for Key Stage Two and 8 iPads & 2 laptops for Foundation Phase. We will continue to invest in online provision such as Purple Mash and My Maths.



POSITIVE FEEDBACK - Dropping Off & Collection Procedures

We want to thank you once again for your feedback to our questionnaire sent out on Friday 25th September. We referred to some points to consider in a previous email and really hope that you can support us in alleviating some of those issues raised.

Reminders

- Drop off times: FP at 8.45am, KS2 at 9.00am.
- Collection times: FP at 3.00pm, KS2 at 3.15pm.
- KS2 parents/grandparents, please avoid arriving and parking during FP time slots.
- If you have children in DIFFERENT phases (e.g. one child in FP/infants & one child in KS2/juniors), you are welcome to drop them off together at the earlier time of 8.45am. These siblings will now be sent up to wait in Breakfast Club. If they are in the same phase (FP/infants or KS2/juniors), please stick to the allocated time.
- If you have children in DIFFERENT phases (e.g. one child in FP/infants & one child in KS2/juniors), you are welcome to collect them together at the later time of 3.15pm. We will keep hold of the younger children until you arrive. If they are in the same phase (FP/infants or KS2/juniors), please stick to the allocated time.
- Breakfast Club this remains open for childcare between 8.00am & 8.30am (booked online at a £2 charge). Free Breakfast Club will be available between 8.30am & 8.40am. Although this is only a small window, we hope that it will help some parents who are trying to get to work. All children must be brought up to the hall doors (keeping a social distance at all times).
- Walking to school depending on the direction you walk from school, we are happy for you to wait either across the road from the school gates (as previously requested) OR alongside the hedgerow/pathway leading down to the school. We want our families to be as safe as possible when dropping off or collecting children.
- Wet weather procedure for dropping off if the weather is not being kind, we do not want children lining up on the driveway. Therefore Classes 1 & 4 will enter Breakfast Club and wait in their contact groups within the hall, supervised by the Breakfast Club staff. Classes 2 & 3 will enter school through the main entrance and go to their own classrooms where they will be supervised by a member of staff.
- Clwb Ddraig (ASC) is open Monday Thursday 3.15pm 5.00pm. All bookings for clubs should be made online. If plans change and you need to book on to Clwb Ddraig, please contact the office ASAP.
- PE days we are recommending that you send children to school in their PE kits. This will give
 some parents a chance to wash the school uniform. Due to our lovely British weather, you may
 like to send children in Navy coloured joggers, leggings and hoodies/jumpers.


Friends of the School
